SDMC sections 22.4225 requires each Contractor to fill out and file a living wage certification with the City Manager within thirty (30) days of Award of the Contract. LWO wand health benefit rates are adjusted annually in accordance with SDI section 22.422(b) to reflect the Consumer Price Index.
