Pursuant to San Diego Municipal Cc 22.3019, construction, alteration, demolition, repair and mainte work performed under this Contract is subject to State prevailing laws. For construction work performed under this Contract cume exceeding \$25,000 and for alteration, demolition, repair and me work performed under this Contract cumelatively exceeding \$1 contractor and its subcontractors shall comply with State prevailing wage laws including, but not limited to, the requirements listed. This requirement is in addition to the requirement to pay Living pursuant to San Diego Municipal Code sections 22.4201 throug Contractor must determine which per diem rate is highest for eclassification of work (i.e. Prevailing Wage Rate or Living Wage and pay the highest of the two rates to their employees.
