This Contract is subject to the City's Living Wage Ordinance (LWO), codified at SDMC sections 22.4201 through 22.424 LWO requires payment of minimum hourly wage rates and other bene unless an exemption applies. SDMC section 22.4225 requires each Contractor to fill out and file a living wage certification with the City Manager within thirty (30) days of Award of the Contract. LWO wand health benefit rates are adjusted annually in accordance with SDM section 22.4220(b) to reflect the Consumer Price Index. Service contracts, financial assistance agreements, and City facilities agreements must include this upward adjustment of wage rates to covemployees on July 1 of each year. In addition, Contractor agrees to require all of its subcontractors, sublessees, and concessionaires subject to the LWO to comply with the LWO and all applicable regulati and rules. 1.1. Exemption from Living Wage Ordinance. Pursuant to SDMC sect 22.4215, this Contract may be exempt from the LWO. For a determine on this exemption, Contractor must complete the Living Wage Ordinar Application for Exemption. C. Highest Wage Rate Applies.
