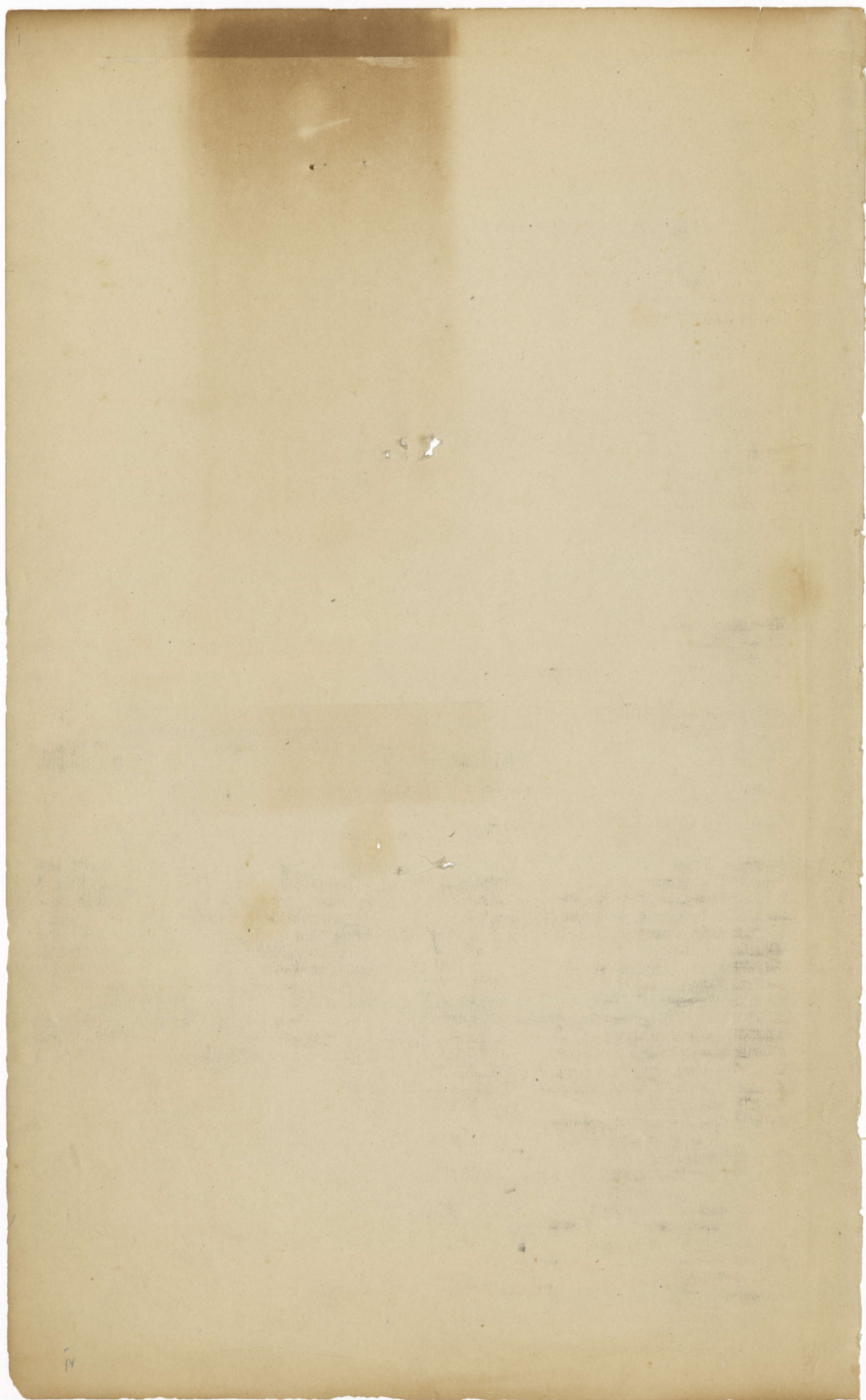

Minutes of meeting held at office of Commissioner Hazzard Jan. 27-1920, all members present.

Minutes of meetings held Oct. 31 and Nov. 14-1919 read and approved.

Report of titles Nos. 8 to 36 inclusive issued with owners names, lot descriptions, and amounts paid for same, also report of earnings from Jan 1-1920 to Jan. 24 in perpetuity fund of \$832.50 and in K-217, formerly known as revolving fund amounting to \$395.35 were submitted.

Mail box tampering.

Supt reported tampering with mail box by unknown parties.

Deeds to read \$1.00

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted: Resolved, That until further notice the deeds to lots shall read uniformly, "For and in consideration of the sum of One dollar." also resolution, Resolved, That, until further notice the Superintendent be directed to make cash rate to undertakers of ten percent below the list price for lots listed from \$25 to \$~~100~~^{99.00}, and of twenty percent for lots listed \$100 and upwards." and that all undertakers be so notified.

Cash rate for lots to undertakers discontinued.

Require burial permits for ashes

Regarding permits for burial of ashes caused adoption of following resolution: Resolved, That Supt be instructed to require burial permits before any interment of ashes of human body from cremation.

L.M. Simpson granted permission to see lot

Application of Lauretta M. Simpson sole heir of J. P. Jones, for permission to sell unused portion of their G.A.R. lot D12-59, Div 1 to a G.A.R. man; on motion the request was granted.

Notice from County undertakers to secure permits for burial in Co. Plot

Notice was read from Board of Supervisors, that all undertakers had been notified to secure County permits for burial of indigents in County plot and instructing Mt. Hope Cemetery to assign such place for burial and to send permits to the Department of Charities.

Minutes of meeting held Mar. 10, 1920. Commissioners W.B. Thorp and G.W. Hazzard present. Minutes of previous meeting read: After correction of cash rate lot price as originally made, from \$25 to \$100 to read \$25 to \$99, minutes were approved.

Secretaryship of Commission was urged upon Mr. Hazzard; as he felt he could not accept, motion was withdrawn and the following motion was adopted: Resolved, That C. A. Bradt be appointed and authorized to perform duties of Secretary to Commission until further notice.

Supt. submitted financial report of earnings since last meeting, also report of titles issued which was accepted and ordered filed. The following resolution was adopted: That, as we have received from Supt. correspondence from the Health Department of the City bearing on the character of a permit for burial of ashes of a human body, Be it Resolved, That same be referred to the City Attorney.

Motion was unanimously voted, That, beginning April 1, 1920, the charge for burials in the County Plot shall be five dollars and all undertakers be so notified.

After discussion regarding permission of lot owners to sell their lots the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That it shall be the policy of the Commission to permit no transfer of title to graves or lots in the sections of the Cemetery which have been placed in perpetual care, unless the lot owners shall have paid to the Commission a sufficient sum of money to cover cost of placing the lot in perpetuity.

Communication regarding perpetuity charge, from A. J. Fairbanks and request from Mrs. Davison were considered. Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Fairbanks the amount required for perpetuity. It was deemed advisable that the price paid for lots where transfers were made by individual lot owners, in all cases be adjusted by the Supt.

Motion adopted, That Treasurer be notified to put money at interest when the perpetuity fund reaches the sum of three thousand dollars.

The question of charge for removals was considered with no definite action.

It was thought wise to hold meetings each month, near the end of the month, the next to the last day when possible. Adopted. Meeting adjourned to meet April 29th 1920.

April 29, 1920,

At a regular meeting of the Cemetery Commission held Apr. 29th, with Commissioners W. B. Thorp and G. W. Hazzard present, minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Supt read his report which was approved.

The matter of increased pay for employees was considered with conclusion that we did not have at the present time sufficient funds to entertain the matter but possibly later in the season the question might be taken up again if the earnings would warrant.

An opinion by City Attorney relative to permits for burial of ashes of human beings was read.

Owing to the demolishing of Cemetery entrance gates and signs, by truckman of Brown and Allen, this question was discussed; suggestions were offered and a plan ~~was~~ submitted by Supt.; also a bid of \$90 from H. J. Gerard to replace the gates and signs; it was deemed wise to give the Commission opportunity to secure further data before definite plans were adopted.

Supt reported the request of Mrs. D. Jones to transfer a G.A.R. lot; no action was taken other than that the Supt had the power to handle such cases.

The questions of undertakers burying in lots owned by others also the rights and privileges of lot owners were discussed with the decision that it was advisable to have a printed form to have permission granted to bury outsiders other than members of the family and the following resolution was adopted relative to such form:

To Superintendent of Mt. Hope Cemetery.

I hereby authorize the burial of body of-----
in my Lot-----Row-----Section-----Div-----, Mt. Hope Cemetery, and I declare under oath, that this permission has been given by me without any compensation or financial consideration whatever.

It was resolved, That until further notice, the Supt be authorized to instruct the Treasurer ~~that~~ when the amount of money held by him in the perpetuity fund reaches one thousand dollars the same be invested.

Meeting adjourned to meet May 27th.

Regular meeting of the Commission held June 2; Present, Commissioners W. B. Thorp and G. W. Hazzard.

Minutes of previous meeting were read; it was suggested that minor changes be made in same before approved.

Supt's report was approved as read. Cemetery entrance matter was discussed. Supt. reported a bid by Southern Calif. Granite Co; Mr. Simpson appeared in behalf of Simpson & Pirnie submitting a rough sketch. Supt was directed to write City Attorney relative to our rights regarding the stone coping removed from lots.

The Jewish cemetery asked for some decomposed granite to surface their road. Motion was adopted, Under the direction of our Supt, the Jewish cemetery be permitted to take material for surfacing their road.

The question of our system of collections caused the following resolution which was adopted: Resolved, That in order to avail themselves of the discount voted at a previous meeting, the undertakers of the city, beginning June 1st, 1920, must pay their bills of the city by the 10th of each month and that the Supt be authorized to do business on that basis. Statements shall be rendered by the Supt. on the first of each month.

Meeting adjourned subject to call.

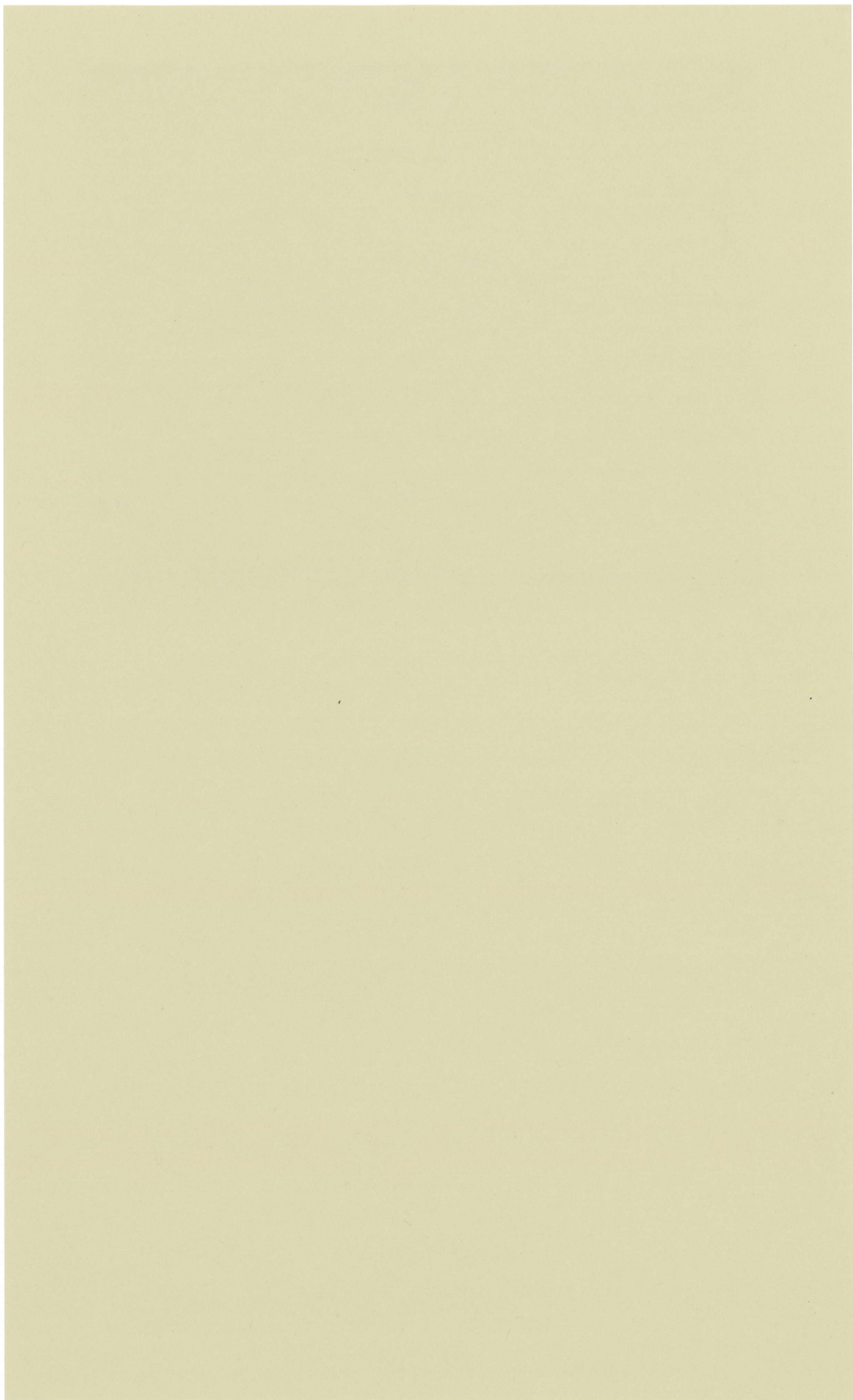

Minutes of regular meeting March 21: Present, Commissioners W. E. Crabtree and G. W. Hazzard. Minutes of meetings Jan. 14 and Jan. 26 read and approved.

SUPT'S REPORT read and approved. Supt reported that COMMON COUNCIL PASSED ORDINANCE ~~XXXXXX~~ March 16 turning back to Cemetery the amount of \$814.24 from the reserve fund.

ANOTHER LOWERING DEVICE: Also, that another lowering device had been ordered and was expected soon. Mr Hazzard spoke of visiting a San Jose Cemetery where lowering straps were used; a lowering device seemed preferable.

SELLING UNDERTAKERS STRING OF LOTS: It was deemed advisable to sell undertakers a string of lots if they wished to purchase same provided they paid the regular price, they to be allowed regular commissions agreed upon.

EXCESS GRAVE OPENING CHARGES: Supt reported being paid grave opening charges in excess of required regular amount; asked disposition of excess charge. As the parties were brought to us by undertakers thus securing the business, it was decided to refund overcharge to undertakers at the end of month when making their monthly settlements.

HIRING EXTRA MEN: It was voted to hire extra men and necessary teams to work on improving sections being put in perpetuity.

REMOVING TREES: Question of removing trees in sections being improved was decided to remove only inferior or infected trees; for the present, other trees should be allowed to stand.

OUR RIGHT TO CHARGE PERPETUITY ON OLD LOTS SOLD BEFORE IMP. Supt was instructed to secure written opinion from City Attorney relative to our rights to charge perpetuity in Mt. Hope Cemetery on old lots sold before improvements were made.

ENDAVOR TO SECURE CO-OPERATION IN SECURING PAY FOR PERPETUITY. Motion was adopted to have letters written to property owners in the sections being improved whose addresses could be obtained, stating our purpose and asking their co-operation in the matter.

DIRECTORY: Supt was authorized to procure new directory.

AUTHORIZING MRS. J. V. HICKS TO SELL HER LOT: On request, motion was adopted authorizing Mrs. J. V. Hicks to sell her lot #17, Sec. 1, Div. 3 to C. A. Bratt.

DUPLICATE TITLE J. S. CHAPMAN LOT: At the request of Bradley & Woolman, it was voted to issue duplicate title to the J. S. Chapman lot, SE¹-Lot 3, Sec. 1, Div. 6. On discussion of commissions paid undertakers on purchase of lots, it was decided to let matter stand as ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ adopted.

SUNDRY QUESTIONS: Questions of purchasing fertilizer, power motor lawn mowers and issuing titles should any tracts of lots be purchased by undertakers were considered without definite action.

Meeting adjourned to meet April 18th.

My dear Sir:

In response to your communication of March 24, 1921, concerning authority of the Cemetery Commission to charge for perpetual care of lots in Mt. Hope Cemetery, permit me to advise you as follows:

In 1919, the people of The City of San Diego amended the Charter so as to authorize the Cemetery Commission to sell lots in Mt. Hope Cemetery, and out of the proceeds thereof provide a sinking fund for the permanent upkeep of graves and lots. Since said amendment was adopted there is no question but that the sale of all lots in Mt. Hope Cemetery carries with it the obligation to perpetually care for the lots so sold. Prior to the date of such amendment it seems to me that the matter was one of pure contract between the Cemetery Commission and the person purchasing the lot. If, for example, A bought a lot in March, 1890, for which he paid \$20.00, and at that time nothing was said as to the perpetual upkeep of the lot, he cannot at this time demand that the Cemetery Commission expend money for the care and upkeep of such lot. On the other hand, the Cemetery Commission cannot at this time insist that he pay a further charge for his lot regardless of the intention of the Commission to expend the moneys received for such further charge in the upkeep of such lot. It is also true that there is nothing in the present law which will prevent the purchaser of such lot and the Cemetery Commission from now entering into an agreement for a consideration for the upkeep of the particular lot in question in the future. If, as you say, A bought a lot in 1890 and now desires to have the same permanently upkept, the Commission may arrange with him to take care of his lot upon the payment of an additional sum of money. This, of course, would go into a sinking fund for the permanent upkeep of lots in Mt. Hope Cemetery.

WINCOTE: Regarding the question of removal of body of Mrs. Wincote, it was decided that as the present Commission was not responsible for the place in the lot in which the father was buried, if the body of the mother was to be removed, the usual charge for removals, \$20, should be charged.

FUTURE BURIAL IN G. A. R. DRY LOTS: It was the unanimous opinion that burial in the G. A. R. dry, ~~XXX~~ cheap lots should be discouraged as we have plenty of perpetuity lots available. Titles signed.

PRESIDENT AUTHORIZED TO SIGN REQUISITIONS: President Roy was authorized to sign requisitions: Clerk was instructed to notify Auditor, Civil Service Commission and Purchasing Department of same.

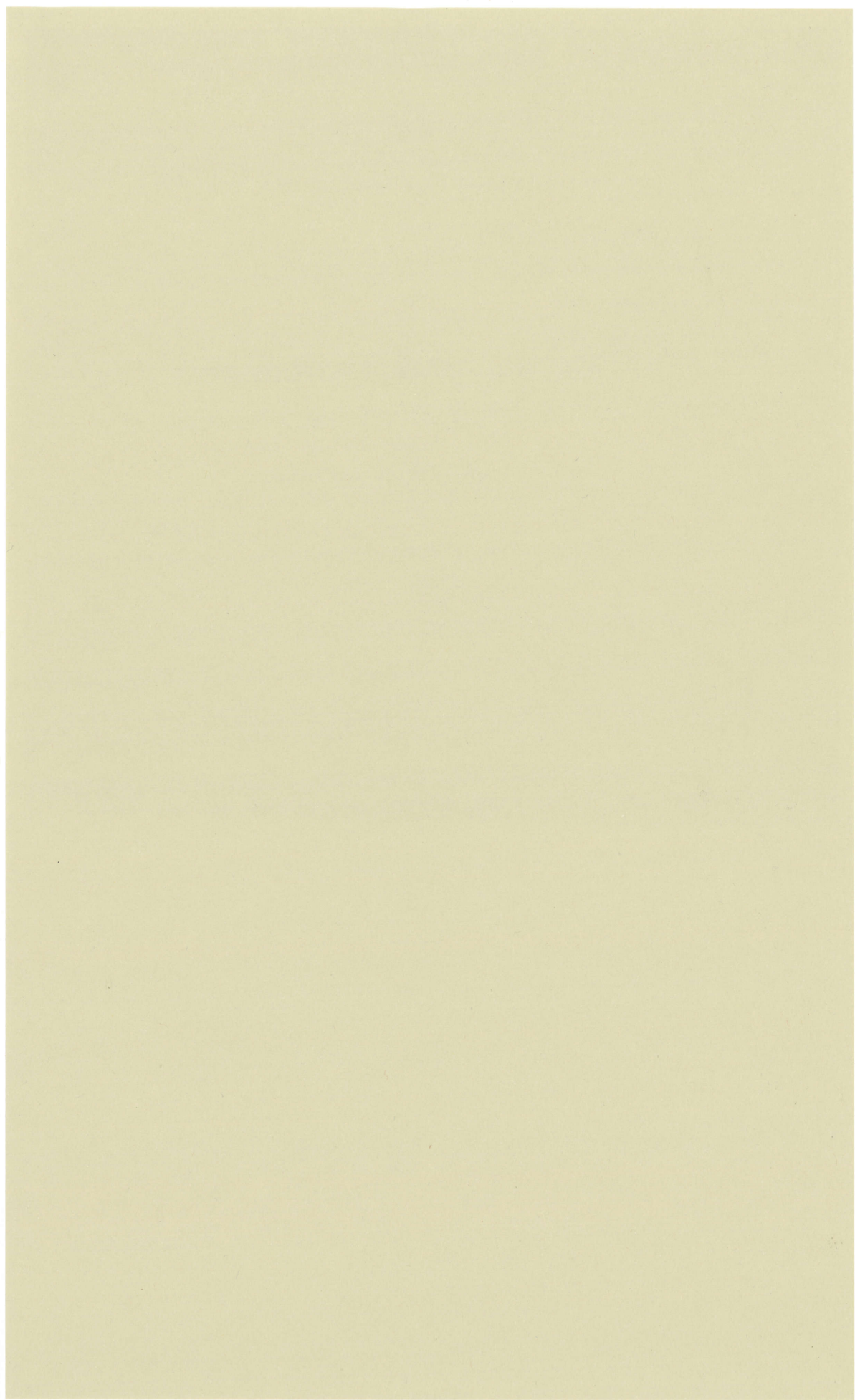

Minutes of meeting held Sept. 2, 1921. Present, Commissioners H. J. Roy, George Webber and E. N. Jones.

Minutes of last meeting read: ~~XXX~~ after discussion regarding Com'r Jones and Webber's visit to Cemetery at which time the septic tank proposition and the Purchasing Dept advertising for bids on same and their authority for so doing, also the Commission's rights in such matters were thoroughly considered, Com'r Jones offered to draw up and submit to City Attorney, a request for a decision as to the Commission's rights in the matter when plans and specifications were submitted for inspection by Supt or any member of the Commission. Motion to this effect was offered, seconded by Com'r Webber and unanimously adopted. Com'r Jones told of an unsatisfactory call being made on him by J. W. Wilson regarding the tank bid, minutes were then approved.

Supt's report was read and ordered filed. It was decided to have Supt furnish statement at next meeting showing list of all investments from perpetuity fund, giving rates of interest on each investment.

ROB'T SMITH MAUSOLEUM: Rob't E. Smith being present, on request of the Commission informed them relative to his purchasing a lot and his desire to erect a mausoleum for the estate of E. Giddings in Block 5. It was desired by the Commission that complete plans and specifications be furnished which was agreed to: On motion by Com'r Jones the following resolution was offered: That permission be granted Mr. Rob't Smith, executor, to have a mausoleum erected in accordance with plans and specifications to be approved by the Board. Adopted. Supt asked who should put in the foundation: After discussion, Supt was ordered to go ahead and put in the foundation.

FRANK MAHER GRIEVANCE: Opportunity was given Frank Maher to state his grievance to the Commission giving his version of the trouble causing his discharge by the Supt and to also make his demand for a vacation with pay to which he claimed he was entitled: His record in the army and his honorable discharge was also presented and considered as was also the Supt's statement regarding the affair who admitted that Maher generally performed good work in the past. Supt was favorable to granting vacation if any way could be found under the existing circumstances to pay for same. Discussion followed regarding the amendments to Charter covering this point: Com'r Webber was asked to get a written opinion from City Attorney relative to such vacation which was covered by amendment 16, Article 10, Proposition 3.

~~Final action regarding Mr. Maher's case was deferred until after hearing to be held before Civil Service Commission as soon as the matter was referred to them.~~
~~Postponed to be referred to the Civil Service Commission as soon as the matter was referred to them.~~

EAGLE'S REQUEST: The unsettled question of the Eagle's Fraternal Organization application for a portion of ground 50 x 100 feet, to be set aside for their use, was presented by H. W. Merkley who stated their desire was also to erect a monument to be built of concrete and reinforced steel with base of about twelve feet square, of obelisk form. Satisfactory plans and specifications are to be furnished to the Commission. He also told of the future desire of the organization to beautify the Eagle's Plot at their own expense.

Com'r Jones moved, That a plot of ground 50 x 100 feet asked for be granted. Motion was adopted and so ordered.

The question of satisfactory curbing for their use was also considered. Mr. Merkley thought a little assistance from the Commission might be necessary of which they thought favorably.

COMMISSION PAID TO UNDERTAKERS: The matter of commissions paid to undertakers on sale of lots brought out the opinion that we were paying too much

COMMISSION ON ROB'T ROWE LOT: The case of Rob't Rowe purchasing lots, the funeral being conducted by Johnson-Saum Co.: Should Commission be paid the undertaker: It was decided that it was through the undertakers that the funeral was secured ^{as} was only right and fair to pay Johnson-Saum Co. the Commission.

ACCOUNTS DUE FROM UNDERTAKERS: The Commission instructed Supt to endeavor to collect accounts due.

STONES ALLOWED: Again the question of stones being allowed on lots was considered causing the following resolution being offered by Com'r Jones: That the resolution in reference to putting in whatever stones they desire adopted May 3, 1921, reading as follows--- That it is agreed to allow lot purchasers to put in whatever stones they desired, be rescinded. Motion adopted unanimously.

GUANO FERTILIZER: Question of purchasing guano fertilizer was recommended by Supt: It was thought wise to confer with Purchasing Agent relative to price: matter was left open.

STORAGE OF BURIAL BOXES: As the manner of storing boxes by undertakers and same being very unsightly, suggestion was made that future action should be taken to care for same and opinion was expressed that it might be made a matter of bringing in a revenue.

G. A. R. TRACT: A portion of the G. A. R. Tract being untidy, suggestion was made that a way should be found to remedy this: Com'r Webber offered to consult with G. A. R. Post relative to removing some curbing.

CONTEMPLATED CLERKSHIP CHANGE: A contemplated change in the clerkship was informally discussed by Supt with no definite action.

COMMISSION MEETINGS: Com'r Webber offered the following resolution----

FINDINGS OF CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION
AFTER PUBLIC HEARING HELD SEPTEMBER 16 & 19, 1921
IN THE CASE OF
DISMISSAL OF FRANK MAHER FROM EMPLOYMENT AT MT. HOPE CEMETERY.

"The testimony given seems to establish that for several months there had been a growing dissatisfaction among certain employees - gossiping, tale-bearing, a feeling that favoritism was shown in some cases, unfair treatment in others, causing jealousies and hard feelings and a general unrest - all of which led up to the fight on August 20th, when Frank Maher struck Louis U. Rustamier, alleging that he was provoked to this action by Rustamier's calling him a vile name and insinuating that he was a thief. The Superintendent, Charles H. Kane, claimed that he felt that the one course of action open to him was to dismiss Maher, as the instigator of the fight, which he did. This Commission feels that Mr. Kane was justified in taking this action.

Testimony shows that Maher had always been regarded as a capable and efficient worker with no charges against his record previous to this occurrence. The Commissioners feel that being removed from the environment which contributed to his sense of discrimination, his services should be of value to the city in some other department.

It is the decision of the Civil Service Commission, therefore, that Frank Maher's name be retained upon the eligible list of laborers."

Motion unanimously adopted; inquiry was made regarding Lipia-(Repens), cost of seed for tract and adjoining ground.

SUSPENDING ACTION IN SECTION 5, DIVISION 2 and IMPROVING SECTION 2, DIVISION 6, ALSO G. A. R. PLOT DIVISIONS 2 & 3: Motion was made, That the action of the former Commission of Jan. 26, 1921, reading as follows--" It was voted to improve Division 1, also Section 5, Division 2, putting said divisions in perpetuity, and it was further decided to close roads, drives and walks not inquired for public use in above divisions," that that portion of minutes regarding Section 5, Division 2, be suspended for the present and that we transfer our efforts from improving Section 5, Division 2, to improving Section 2, Division 6, also Divisions 2 and 3, G. A. R. Plot. Motion was unanimously adopted and so ordered.

That on and after January 1st, 1922, the practice of allowing a ten and twenty per cent reduction on cemetery lots sold to undertakers be and the same is hereby discontinued, and that, the selling price of said lots shall be strictly in accordance with the official schedule of prices of lots on file in the office of Mount Hope Cemetery, without any discount what-so-ever.

Be it further resolved:- That the Superintendent of the Cemetery sees to it, that each and every undertaker doing business with Mount Hope Cemetery be furnished with a copy of this resolution for his information.

Motion was made, That this resolution shall not be put into effect until after a meeting of the Commission is held at which all undertakers in the city shall be invited to be present in order to present their views for and against the resolution; that its adoption at this time shall be considered tentatively, only. Adopted.

SPECIAL MEETING:- It was decided to hold a special meeting on the evening of Jan. 11th or near that date, meeting to be held in the office of the Mayor if possible and that the Mayor be invited to be present; also, that the Mayor be furnished with a copy of notice to be sent to all undertakers; Resolution to this effect was adopted.

RESOLUTIONS RELATIVE TO AMOUNT FOR SALE OF LOTS BE SHOWN ON DEEDS AND SCHEDULE PRICE FOR LOTS: The following resolutions were submitted and adopted. **BE IT RESOLVED** by the CEMETERY COMMISSION:

That on and after January 1st, 1922, all deeds for lots sold in Mount Hope Cemetery shall show the amount in dollars and cents actually paid for said lots as per official schedule of the prices of lots on the date of sale, in the office of Mount Hope Cemetery.

and

RESOLVED by the CEMETERY COMMISSION:-

That this Cemetery Commission prepare an official schedule of the price at which each and every lot for sale in the surveyed divisions of Mount Hope Cemetery shall be sold. These prices will be noted on the plat of each division by reference to the schedule of prices of the number of the lot or lots, and the Superintendent in making his monthly report of sales to the Commission of said lots, will cause a memorandum to be attached to his report showing the number of the lot, the division where located, and the amount received therefor.

Be it further resolved:- That for the purpose of carrying into effect this resolution for preparing of price lists or schedule of prices of lots, That Commissioners E. N. Jones and George Webber constitute a committee of this Commission to carry into effect this resolution with power to call on the Superintendent and the Clerk of the Cemetery for such assistance as may be required in the preparation of the same.

MONTHLY AND DAY MEN: As it was decided to carry only six permanent laborers for 1922 and hire day laborers as needed, the ~~selection~~ selection and handling the matter was left to the discretion of the Supt. entirely.

Minutes of special meeting held at the Mayor's office the evening of Jan. 11th with Commissioners H. J. Roy and E. N. Jones present. There were only two undertakers responding to the invitation sent to undertakers to be present--namely--J. T. Barkley and H. W. Merkley. Through unknown reason, representatives of the following cemeteries who mistook this meeting for the intended meeting of Feb. 2nd, were present, namely-- Mr. Carpenter and Mr. Gerard of the Odd Fellows, Mr. Partridge, of the Masonic, Messrs Smith and Bull of Greenwood.

Comm'r Jones told of the Commission's desire to make the City Cemetery beautiful and have all the surrounding cemeteries in keeping with this idea. He suggested that all the cemetery representatives should plan and work together to this end which was fully in accord with all the representatives present who were asked their views regarding same. Each one was heartily in accord with the suggestion, giving their several ideas along different lines and they were also of the opinion that uniformity for price of lots would be beneficial and that the City could help along these lines.

Com'r Roy told that it was the City's idea to maintain and beautify our cemetery and didn't think that the Commission intended to make it a business competition.

The prevailing idea was that discounts should not be allowed undertakers and that the price of lots might be raised. All agreed that schedule of lots should be established and maintained.

The charge of opening graves both here and in other cemeteries was discussed.

Com'r Jones was impressed with the unbusinesslike methods of selling lots and was decidedly in favor of having all graves kept green.

Mr. Carpenter favored having a motion that all get together to establish a uniform price for lots which was favored by the other representatives present though no such motion was adopted.

Mr. Barkley gave his views regarding the plan of selling graves, who should be responsible for assuming the charge; He favored having the cemeteries assume the responsibility claiming that the cemeteries made the rules and the undertakers had to abide by them.

Mr. Merkley followed with a convincing talk regarding the paying of commissions, the assuming of responsibilities for collecting the cemetery charges, the price of lots, the superiority and attractiveness of lots in Mt. Hope.

The Commission invited all present to attend the next regular meeting to be held Feb 2nd.

Meeting adjourned.

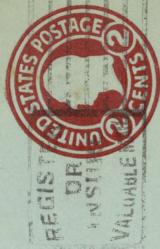

Minutes of meeting held Feb. 2: Present Comrs E. N. Jones and H. J. Roy. As this was a general meeting there were also present in response to invitation sent, Messrs Jos. Smith and Mr. Rogers, representing Greenwood; Messrs Fox, Samisch and Straus of Home of Peace cemetery; Messrs Partridge and Belding, the Masonic; Mr. Gerard representing the Odd Fellows; Messrs J. S. Smith and A. E. Vest, Datus E. Coon G. A. R. Post; Capt Thos. S. Carney, the Bennington Camp Spanish Amer. War Veterans.

President Roy called on Com'r Jones for statement who outlined the ambition and desires of the Cemetery Commission for co-operation of all the cemeteries, asking for an exchange of ideas.

S. I. Com'r Jones offered to interview City Clerk Wright to request him to make arrangement with the Council for the earliest opportunity to present petition to pave Imperial Ave as above ~~XXXXXX~~ mentioned, said petition to be signed by all the organizations interested and that a full representation of all organizations be present at the Council meeting which would carry great weight and influence. Motion as offered was unanimously adopted. Com'r Roy suggested, that if there was no objection, the Secretary should draft a petition to be presented.

ABOLISHING PAYMENT OF COMMISSIONS: The question of abolishing payment of commissions to undertakers for sale of lots was discussed as was also the question of price to be charged for grave openings: It was decided to abolish the payment of commissions to undertakers for sale of lots, same to take effect Feb. 2, 1922.

J. S. SMITH READS GOV'T LAWS: J. S. Smith read a copy of the law regarding the burial of soldiers, sailors and of all service men in Charity Plots which is prohibited by the U. S. Government.

SALE PRICE OF LOTS: It was decided by the committee of Mt. Hope to consider and establish the sale price of lots and to take action some time next week to establish a tentative scale.

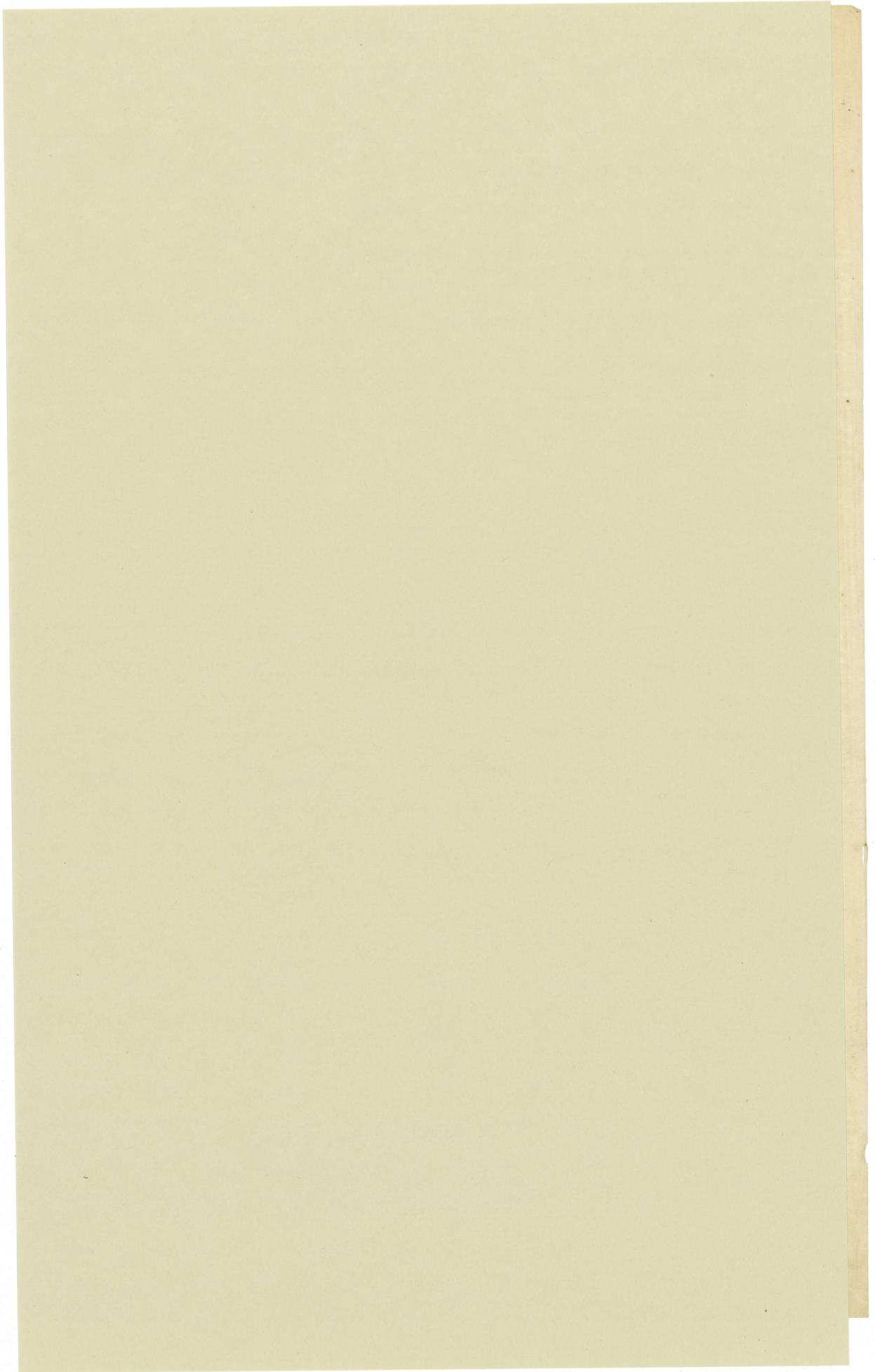

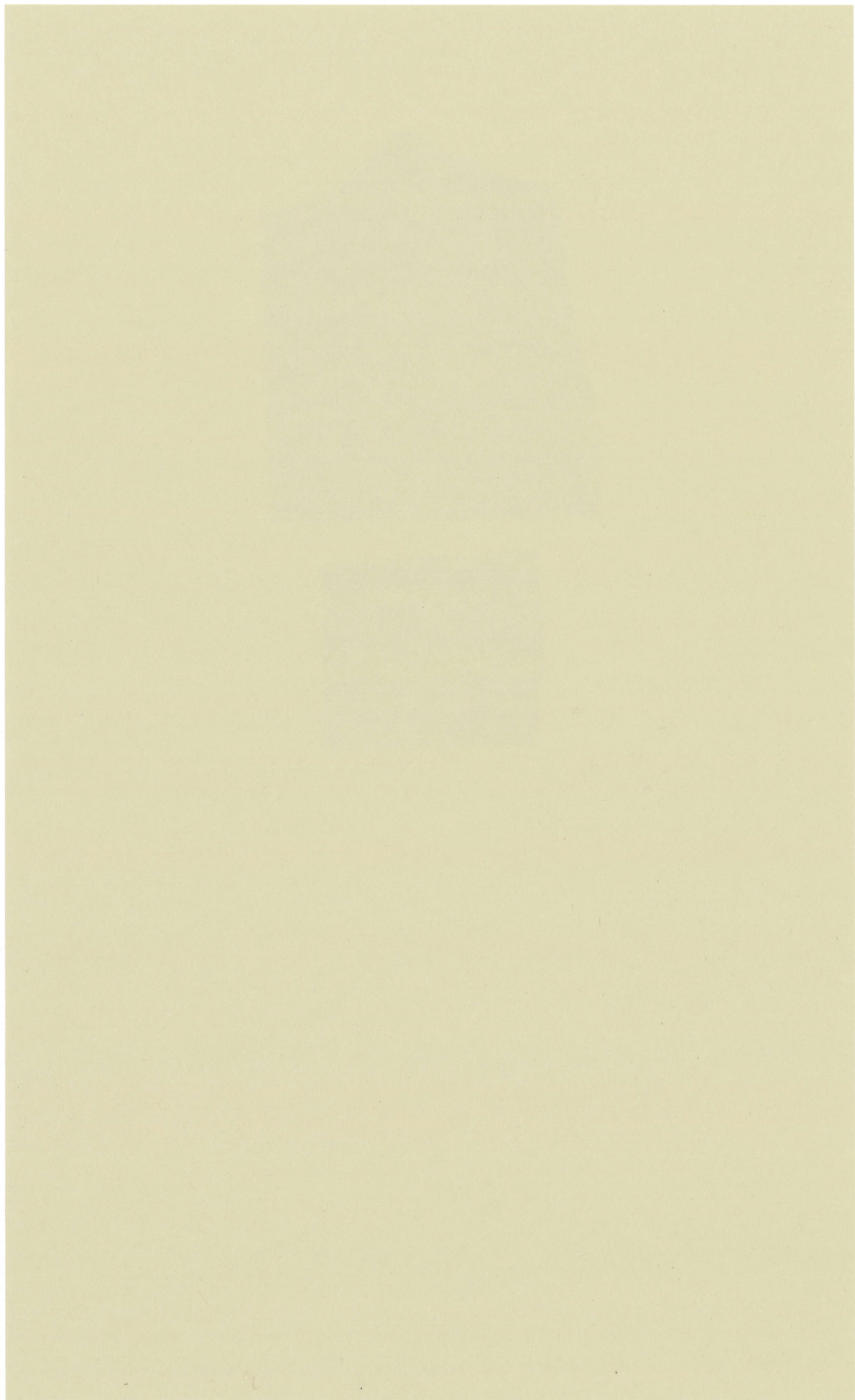

The Spanish Americans War Veterans Plot $\frac{1}{2}$ 50 x 100 ft was graded and planted to Tipia Ripans and otherwise improved.

Sections Three-Four-Five- & Six of Div. Six were regraded and now ready to put in grass, in these sections the Cemetery has reclaimed a considerable amount of ground.

Also Section Two of Div Six was regraded and sowed to grass.

A necessary drain has been built on the west side of Grevelle Ave. from sections Five and Six of Div. Six to Cypress Ave. a distance of 225 ft. this was regraded and walled to a height of three feet with rock and cement on the East side, and the entire bottom sodded to a width of five feet and a raise of three feet on the West side, this drain was washed out ~~xxxxx~~ during last springs rain to an average depth and width of five feet.

During the year 270 trees were set out in various parts of the cemetery.

Six hundred feet of fence was rebuilt.

Water mains.

One thousand ft. 1 in eighthundred ft. $\frac{3}{4}$ in and two hundred ft 2 in water pipe has been put in by our own men.

Gentlemen:

I desire to again invite your attention to a survey and report submitted by me to the Cemetary Commission under date of February 6, 1922, which was substantially as follows:

" An approximate computation shows that there are about 708,500 square feet of ground in Mount Hope Cemetary under care at a cost of \$22,414.74 during the past year.

This would give an approximate cost of three cents per square foot of ground as an average for yearly upkeep.

I have estimated that an additional cost of one half cent per square foot should be added to this amount to cover the cost to the City of the water used in caring for this area.

The City at any time might pursue the policy of charging the cost of this water against the Cemetary for bookkeeping purposes.

The roadways cover nearly one third the total area; in other words there should be charged against the lots an additional one cent per square foot for maintenance of roads; this would make a fair average figure of four and a half cents per square foot per year as a basis on which to estimate the amount of income necessary to obtain from lots sold in order to care for the lots and roadways. This estimate is based on the assumption that all lots of any section of the Cemetary have been sold for an amount sufficient to provide a yearly income of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ per square foot of the area of the lots sold, and that all lots in any section or area under care have been sold, and that no dead weight is carried, such as lots sold for too small an amount, lots unsold, but which must be kept up, all lots paid for, etc.

Given sufficient time, all lots in a subdivision will be sold, and an additional charge should be placed against these lots to provide funds for the opening up and development of new sections or subdivisions, while they are being marketed.

I have not gone sufficiently into detail to make more than a rough approximate estimate of the lots which have been sold, the money received from which has already been expended, no longer recoverable and no longer an asset, but am of the opinion that a lot approximately 40 square feet in area will cost at least \$1.80 per annum for upkeep; if a minimum price of \$35.00 per lot is received, this amount at 5% would produce \$1.75, or only 5¢ short of the amount necessary for the upkeep of a lot sold at the minimum price of \$35.00; other lots which are sold for more than \$35.00 would increase the average price and would provide sufficient funds for the upkeep of all the lots sold, the interest from these sums, which are deposited with the City Treasurer as a Perpetuity Fund, being used to defray the operating expenses of the Cemetary.

I am of the opinion that the price of lots should be not less than \$1.00 per square foot, and that the price of the choicest lots should be at least \$5.00 per square foot, other lots intermediately priced; I am inclined to the extremer view that it would be better business to charge an average price of \$1.25 per square foot; this on account of the fact that some are unable to pay, others default in payment, and we should provide a burial place for any one whether they are able to pay only four, five ten or twenty dollars, but we should charge the full price, and endeavor to collect it, just as we would in any ordinary business, and where the full price cannot be collected, receipt should be given for the amount collected and the uncollectable residue should be frankly treated as a business loss, and treated as a charity debt or an uncollectable debt according to the financial circumstances of the survivors of the deceased's family.

Dear Sir:

In response to your request of May 8th, 1924, as to the authority of the Cemetery Commission to employ an architect and to contract for the construction of a storage building, permit me to advise you as follows:

Section 3 of Chapter 9 of Article V of the City Charter, provides that the Commission shall be authorized to expend moneys coming into its hands other than from the sale of lots as may be deemed advisable, for maintaining, beautifying and improving the grounds of the cemetery. Under this authority the Commission undoubtedly would have the right to authorize the construction of a storage building, to be used for cemetery purposes in Mount Hope Cemetery, and in payment therefor to use funds in the Cemetery Fund. However, if the cost of the employment of said architect and of the construction of said building exceeds the sum of \$500.00, the expenditure must be made in accordance with the terms and provisions of People's Ordinance No. 5051. Under this ordinance a request must be made to the Purchasing Department, who will advertise for bids for both the architect's services and the construction of the building.

If any of these bids are accepted and the work is authorized the whole matter is then placed in the hands of the Common Council

who by the terms and provisions of Subdivision 52 of Chapter II, Article II of the City Charter has "charge, superintendence and control of all public work of any kind, where not otherwise provided for in this charter, to be done for the City or for any board or department thereof, and also of the furnishing of all labor, work, materials and supplies for said City. This charge, superintendence and control of the public work shall be subject, however, to such ordinances as the Common Council may from time to time adopt."

Unless, therefore, the Common Council should by ordinance authorize the Cemetery Commission to take charge of this construction work, the sole function of the Cemetery Commission in regard thereto would be to request the Purchasing Department to advertise for bids and authorize the expenditure of the money. Thereafter the work would be in the hands of the Common Council until completed.



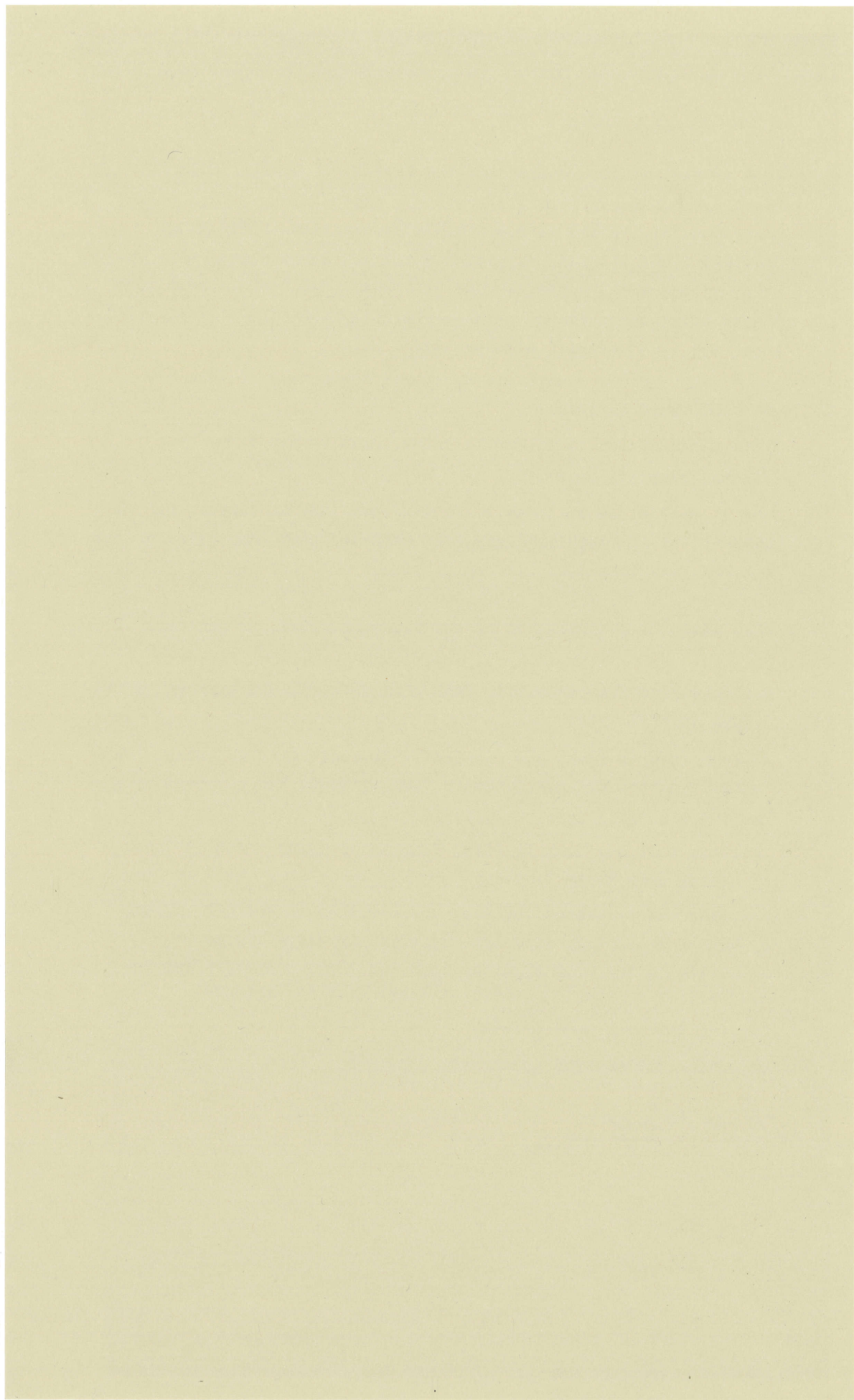

CONTROVERSY ON CEMETERY GETS HEARING

Labor Wage Scale Also Gets Inning at Lively Budget Hearing

An open break between the cemetery commission and representatives of the Greenwood Memorial association at council's budget session last night brought to a head a controversy that began more than a year ago.

When the commissioners asked council for the same appropriation they had last year, \$18,000, the secretary of the Greenwood cemetery announced he wanted an explanation of how Mt. Hope, the city cemetery, was financed.

"We have investigated several reports and know lots have been sold for less than other cemeteries do," he declared, "and it

is a matter of common knowledge that every cent they take from the sale of lots goes into the perpetual maintenance fund. Other cemeteries, including ours, put only 25 per cent of this into the perpetuity fund.

TAXES FOR GRAVES

"Many of our lot holders are now objecting to paying taxes for maintaining other people's graves."

"The city charter compels us to put all the money from the sale of lots into the perpetuity fund, and this now amounts to about \$60,000," Col. E. N. Jones, one of the commissioners, explained. "The interest from this and funds realized from grave digging, however, is insufficient to maintain the cemetery."

"Thus we must ask council for a subsidy. At present we have \$85,000 in salable ground, and with the \$60,000 in the fund, we are really ahead of the game."

"We do not undersell lots except in the case of Grand Army men, in which case we believe we are justified, especially if the veteran was in reduced circumstances."

The Greenwood secretary announced himself as satisfied with this explanation, and council was inclined to agree, and allowed the commissioners \$18,000 more on which to run the cemetery another year.

Councilmen Held and Bruschi precipitated another controversy when they recommended a raise in wages for manual laborers in the parks and operating department, declaring that "all the white collar workers have been raised, and the others are certainly entitled to it."

The present scale for laborers is \$4 a day.

Council voted to give the park 12½ cents on each \$100 valuation and the zoo 2¼ cents, and park commissioners said they intended to raise the men to \$4.25 a day.

My dear Mr Kane;

Answering your communication of the 16th instant relative to the taking over of the Odd Fellows Cemetery as a part of Mt. Hope, I beg to state the information contained in your letter was not sufficient for me to render an opinion upon it.

Section 8 of Chapter 2, of Article II of the Charter provides:

"Section 8. The Common Council shall make no appropriation in aid of any corporation, person, or society, unless expressly authorized by the charter or the laws of the state"

It is my understanding that ~~the~~ a Cemetery Board, selling lots under a guarantee of perpetual care, shall place in a sinking fund a certain percentage of the purchase price of such lots for the purpose of insuring such perpetual care. You do not state in your letter whether or not this has been done by the Odd Fellows. If it has not been done and if no moneys are turned over to the City to meet the obligation of perpetual care assumed by the Odd Fellows, I believe it would be necessary for the Common Council to make an appropriation to ~~fulfill~~ fulfill the obligations assumed by the Odd Fellows in the sale of cemetery lots where the Odd Fellows guaranteed perpetual care. It would appear that if the maintenance of this cemetery is not profitable for the Odd Fellows it ~~would~~ will not be a profitable matter for the City.

Until you can furnish me all the data in connection with this transfer. I intend to withhold my opinion as to whether or not the transfer can be made.

I am returning herewith the communication of the Odd Fellows to the Cemetery Board, dated of Sept. 27, 1924, and also the two forms of deeds submitted by you.

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 71

Setting Apart Certain Lands for Cemetery.

(Approved April 5th, 1875)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, California as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby set apart, dedicated, donated and reserved to the County Supervisors of San Diego County, and State of California, in trust for County Cemetery purposes only, all that certain lot, tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the City and County of San Diego, and State of California, bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at a mound of stones in the east line of the Pueblo and bearing north $17^{\circ}.00$, west 23.79 chains from the southeast corner of the original Cemetery reservation; thence south $78^{\circ}.56$ west (true Meridian) along a fence 11.78 chains to a mound of stones; thence north 10.76 chains to a mound of stones; thence east 8.90 chains to Pueblo line at a mound of stones, thence $17^{\circ}.00$ east along east line of Pueblo 8.89 chains to place of beginning, containing 10 acres, more or less, as surveyed by L. L. Lockling, a copy of which is now on file in the County Recorder's office of San Diego County.

Section 2. The said County Supervisors of San Diego County shall have the free and exclusive use and control of said tract of land forever for County Cemetery purposes only; subject, however, to such general supervision as may be vested in the corporate authorities of said City by the laws of the State.
