Contractor shall not be required to hire only registered subcontractors and is exempt from submitting list of all subcontractors that is required in section 11 above. (Lab Code section 1773.3). B. Living Wages. This Contract is subject to the City's Living Wage Ordinance (LWO), codified at SDMC sections 22.4201 through 22 LWO requires payment of minimum hourly wage rates and other unless an exemption applies. SDMC section 22.4225 requires ea Contractor to fill out and file a living wage certification with the City Manager within thirty (30) days of Award of the Contract. LW and health benefit rates are adjusted annually in accordance with section 22.4220(b) to reflect the Consumer Price Index. Service contracts, financial assistance agreements, and City facilities agreements must include this upward adjustment of wage rates to employees on July 1 of each year. In addition, Contractor agrees require all of its subcontractors, sublessees, and concessionaires subject to the LWO to comply with the LWO and all applicable regand rules. 1.1. Exemption from Living Wage Ordinance. Pursuant to SDMC 22.4215, this Contract may be exempt from the LWO. For a dete on this exemption, Contractor must complete the Living Wage Or Application for Exemption. C. Highest Wage Rate Applies.
